

To apply, follow the guidelines below:

- Pay strict attention to deadlines!
- Complete applications neatly and accurately, following instructions exactly.
- Submit <u>completed</u> applications in the Counseling Center; it is your responsibility to make sure the application is complete.
- If a transcript is required, it must be mailed by the Counseling Center. Include a signed "Green Sheet" to permit release of your transcript (remember the 10-day lead time).
- If a scholarship does not require a transcript, follow the instructions on the application and mail it as directed.
- If you receive a scholarship, be sure to send a thank you note to the organization granting you the scholarship.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS?

Each scholarship has a unique application that must be completed. See the application for criteria and details.

Nomination Scholarships: You must be nominated by a teacher or counselor; eligible students are encouraged to selfnominate.

All other Scholarships: Complete the application making sure you follow the instructions exactly.

- Remember that any scholarships requiring a transcript must be submitted to the Counseling Center with a Transcript Request Form (green sheet) at least 10 school days before the due date. It is your responsibility to make sure the application is complete.
- If the scholarship requires a transcript, the application will be mailed by the Counseling Center.
- If the scholarship does not require a transcript, it is your responsibility to follow all instructions given to submit the completed application to the scholarship organization before the due date.
- If you are the recipient of a scholarship, be sure to write a **thank you note** to the scholarship granting organization.

Monroe County Sheriff's Office

Teen Police Academy



The Monroe County Sheriff's Office Teen Police Academy is designed to give teens across the county an introduction to law enforcement training. Teens will also gain an understanding of law enforcement's role in our community. The training will include classroom instruction, actual role-plays and **rigorous** physical fitness training. It is our hope that teens will build confidence while learning good decision-making and leadership skills. There is **no charge** to attend the academy. Class sizes will be limited so the selection process will be very competitive. The applicant's school will first determine if he/she meets the criteria listed below to determine if they are eligible for an interview. If the applicant meets the criteria for an interview, he/she will then be notified by their school if/when an interview will be set up with deputies from the Monroe County Sheriff's Office. An interview with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office is not a guarantee that you will be selected for one of the Teen Police Academy weeks.

The Monroe County Sheriff's Office Teen Police Academy will offer two separate weeks to attend the academy. The teens that are chosen will attend only one of those weeks. The first academy class will be held from July 8th through July 12th, 2019 from 8AM to 4PM. The second academy class will be held from July 22nd through July 26th, 2019 from 8AM to 4PM. Academy classes will be held at the Public Safety Training Facility, 1190 Scottsville Road, Rochester, NY 14624. The daily schedule will consist of physical training, classroom instruction and reality-based training, and will end each day with a team building exercise. Teens will be issued a Monroe County Sheriff's Office Teen Police Academy T-shirt on the first day of class and will be required to wear this every day. We also require that the teens wear comfortable athletic shoes. Teens will be given a ½ hour lunch break each day and will be responsible for bringing their own lunch Monday through Thursday. A lunch will be provided on the Friday of each academy session in honor of the successful completion of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Teen Police Academy. Daily attendance is mandatory in order to graduate from the program.

Requirements

- Must attend an approved school in Monroe County
- Must currently be in 9th through 12th grade at the time of application process
- Must have little or no disciplinary issues
- Must be in good standing academically
- Must be in good physical health
- Must return application to your school contact by March 8, 2019

Important Information for Seniors

Remember to schedule your senior appointment with your counselor. <u>This meeting is required regardless of your post-secondary plans</u>. Stop in to the Counseling Center Reception Desk to make an appointment.

- ✓ Be sure you've submitted your electronic application using either the Common Application or a specific college application.
- ✓ If you've applied using a paper application, be sure to submit all required paperwork along with the green sheet to Mrs. Leatzaw in the Counseling Center.
- ✓ Be sure to submit a completed green sheet (transcript request form) to Mrs. Leatzaw in the Counseling Center for each college you've applied to.
- ✓ List all colleges you've applied to in your Naviance Student account under 'Colleges I'm Applying to.'

College Acceptance:

- ✓ When you receive an acceptance from a college or you know which college you will be attending, be sure to fill out a yellow slip in the Counseling Office and give it to Mrs. Leatzaw. One pennant per college will be put on display in the Cafeteria.
- ✓ If you applied to any colleges that require mid-year grades, see Mrs. Leatzaw in the Counseling Office for a blue request form.

After You Receive Your Admission Decisions:

- ✓ You must notify each college or university that accepts you whether you are accepting or rejecting its offer. You should make these notifications as soon as you have made a final decision as to the college you wish to attend, but no later than May 1. It is understood that May 1 will be the postmark date.
- You may confirm your intention to enroll and, if required, submit a deposit to only <u>one</u> college or university. The exception to this arises if you are put on a wait list by a college or university and are later admitted to that institution. You may accept the offer and send a deposit. However, you must immediately notify a college or university at which you previously indicated your intention to enroll.
- ✓ If you are accepted under an early decision plan, you must promptly withdraw the applications submitted to other colleges and universities and make no additional applications. If you are an early decision candidate and are seeking financial aid, you need not withdraw other applications until you have received notification about financial aid from the admitting early decision institution.

Rochester Scholars is the University's pre-college academic enrichment program for high school students which offer non-credit mini-courses reflective of areas of study available at the University.

Courses are structured like college seminars and promote learning by doing. Students actively participate in a variety of workshops, class discussions, field trips, group projects, experiments, and labs, putting newfound knowledge to use in independent and creative ways. Classes are taught by university faculty and graduate students, along with top local educators.

Students can choose to take a morning class, an afternoon class, or both. Books, supplies and lunch are included. Enrollment is limited, so be sure to register early.
