## **Important Information for Seniors**

#### **College Acceptance:**

✓ When you receive an acceptance from a college or you know which college you will be attending, fill out a yellow slip in the Counseling Office and give it to Mrs. Ottman. One pennant will be put on display in the Cafeteria for each college a senior is accepted to.



#### Mid - Year Grades:

✓ If you applied to any colleges that require mid-year grades, see Mrs. Ottman in the Counseling Office for a blue request form starting in January. Mid-year grades will be submitted to colleges in February after first semester grades are complete.

#### **After You Receive Your Admission Decisions:**

- ✓ You must notify each college or university that accepts you whether you are accepting or rejecting its offer. You should make these notifications as soon as you have made a final decision regarding the college you wish to attend no later than May 1, 2020. It is understood that May 1 will be the postmark date.
- ✓ You must confirm your intention to enroll and, if required, submit a deposit to only <u>one</u> college or university. The exception to this arises if you are put on a waitlist by a college or university and are later admitted to that institution. You may accept the offer and send a deposit. However, you must immediately notify the college or university you previously indicated your intention to enroll.



✓ If you are accepted under an early-decision plan, you must promptly withdraw the applications submitted to other colleges and universities and make no additional applications. If you are an early-decision candidate and are seeking financial aid, you need not withdraw other applications until you have received notification about financial aid from the admitting early-decision institution.



# 10 Common Mistakes Made on the FAFSA

# Many schools and states use the FAFSA to determine student aid.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly known as the <u>FAFSA</u>, is a form that determines student aid eligibility for federal student loans and grants. Many <u>colleges</u> and universities as well as states also use the form to determine students' eligibility for nonfederal need-based aid – additional funds students can use to <u>pay for school</u>. But making a mistake on the FAFSA or submitting the application late can result in processing delays or limit the amount of aid awarded to a student, according to the <u>National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators</u>. For families completing the FAFSA, here are 10 common mistakes to avoid.

## Not filling out the FAFSA form early

Parents and students can complete the FAFSA as early as Oct. 1 for the following academic year. While the application deadline isn't until June 30, financial aid administrators recommend applying early since some states and colleges have <a href="mailto:earlier deadlines">earlier deadlines</a> and limited funds. "It is so critical that students and parents pay attention to deadlines and complete the FAFSA as soon as it becomes available," says David Carnevale, director of undergraduate financial aid at <a href="mailto:Chapman">Chapman</a> University in California.



## Using an incorrect Social Security number

While most <u>mistakes</u> on the online FAFSA application can be corrected after submission, an error in the Social Security number of the student or parent may require the submission of an entirely new application, experts say. For students with parents who are not U.S. citizens or legal residents with a Social Security number, the Department of Education advises using "000-00-0000" when completing the form.

## Not listing schools where you plan to apply

Applicants can <u>list up to 10 schools</u> on the online FAFSA. If you don't include a school where you're planning to apply, that college or university won't receive your information. To make changes or add a school to the FAFSA, an applicant needs to log in to his or her FAFSA account and select the option Make FAFSA Corrections. Alternately, applicants can send up to four changes at a time on a paper version of their Student Aid Report by mail. The SAR is a summary of the FAFSA data submitted, and it's sent to the applicant via email or postal mail.

## Failing to use your legal name

"Don't enter nicknames or other variations on your name," according to the NASFAA website. The names an applicant lists on the application for a student or a <u>parent</u> must match government documents, such as a birth certificate or Social Security card. If the FAFSA has been submitted with an incorrect name, the applicant needs to submit a name change via the paper version of the SAR or contact a financial aid office at one of the colleges listed on the SAR report.

## Not completing the FAFSA each year

Students must complete and submit the FAFSA annually to be considered each school year for <u>federal work-study</u> and funds such as the <u>Pell Grant</u>, <u>federal student loans</u> and the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, or FSEOG.

## Listing parental marriage status incorrectly

A common mistake is not disclosing remarriage, says Sean Moore, founder of SMART College Funding and a certified financial planner. He says the initial question about parents is confusing. That's question 59 on the 2017-2018 FAFSA, which reads, "As of today, what is the <u>marital status of your legal parents</u> (biological and/or adoptive)?" The Department of Education wants to know the marital status as of the day the FAFSA is signed. If an applicant's custodial parent has remarried, the stepparent's information will need to be included on the FAFSA.

## Listing income that doesn't match IRS information

In most instances, the FAFSA requires tax information from the <u>prior-prior year</u>. That means, in most instances, families will need tax information from 2017 when they're completing the FAFSA for the 2019-2020 academic year. "If any of the answers do not match the information on the parents' tax returns, the FAFSA form will be rejected," says Lindy Schneider, a Denver-based college adviser and author of "College Secrets of Highly Successful People." Financial aid experts also recommend having tax information handy when filling out the form or using the <u>IRS Data Retrieval Tool</u>, which automatically transfers tax information to the online FAFSA and reduces the probability of errors.

## Leaving too many fields blank

With the more than 100 questions listed on the FAFSA, filling out the form can be a confusing, complicated process for many students and their families. But financial aid experts say that leaving too many blanks on the form may cause a miscalculation or even a <u>rejected application</u>. Instead of leaving an answer to a question blank, the NASFAA advises applicants to enter "0" or "not applicable." Applicants who have a question about the FAFSA form can contact the Federal Student Aid Information Center, known as the FSAIC, which provides support on behalf of the Department of Education. The FSAIC is available at 800-433-3243.

## Failure to register for Selective Service

Male students ages 18 to 25 must register with the Selective Service System to be eligible for financial aid. "Virtually all male U.S. citizens, regardless of where

they live, and male immigrants, whether documented or undocumented, residing in the United States, who are 18 through 25, are required to register with Selective Service," according to the agency.

## Forgetting to sign your application

If an applicant doesn't sign the FAFSA, the form is considered incomplete and won't be processed. "One of the most common mistakes a student will make regarding the FAFSA is simply not completing it," Carnevale says. Applicants will need their Federal Student Aid ID, or FSA ID, to sign electronically. Parents and students can find a link to obtain an FSA ID through the <u>Federal Student Aid website</u>. While many applicants submit the form online, applicants can also print the signature page and submit the FAFSA via mail.

# 7 Things You Need Before You Fill Out the 2019–20 FAFSA® Form

If you need financial aid to help you pay for college, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form. The 2019–20 FAFSA form will be available on Oct. 1, 2018. You should fill it out as soon as possible on or after Oct. 1 at the official government site, fafsa.gov.

It'll be easier to complete the FAFSA form if you gather what you need ahead of time. Below is what you'll need to fill it out.

#### 1. Your FSA ID\*

An FSA ID is a username and password that you can use to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education (ED) websites. Each student, and one parent of each dependent student, will need an FSA ID to complete the FAFSA process on <u>fafsa.gov</u>. We recommend creating your FSA ID early—even before you're ready to complete the FAFSA form—to avoid delays in the process.

For step-by-step instructions, watch *How to Create Your FSA ID*.

IMPORTANT: Do NOT create an FSA ID on behalf of someone else. That means parents should not create FSA IDs for their children and vice versa. Doing so may result in issues signing and submitting the FAFSA form and could lead to financial aid delays. (Also, it's against the rules to create an FSA ID for someone else.)

#### To summarize:

- Anyone who plans to fill out the 2019–20 FAFSA form should create an FSA ID as soon as possible.
- If you are required to provide parent information on your FAFSA form, your parent should create an FSA ID too.
- Because your FSA ID is equivalent to your signature, parents and students each need to create their own FSA IDs using their own email address and phone number. Parents should not create an FSA ID for their child and vice versa.
- In some situations, you may need to wait up to three days to use your FSA ID after creating it. If you want to avoid FAFSA delays, create your FSA ID now

## 2. Your Social Security number\*

You can find the number on your Social Security card. If you don't have access to it, and don't know where it is, ask your parent or legal guardian or get a new or replacement Social Security card from the Social Security Administration. If you are not a U.S. citizen, but meet Federal Student Aid's <u>basic eligibility requirements</u>, you'll also need your Alien Registration number.

#### 3. Your driver's license number

If you don't have a driver's license, then don't worry about this step.

#### 4. Your 2017 tax records\*

In case you didn't hear about the <u>changes we made to the FAFSA process</u>, beginning with the 2017–18 FAFSA form, we now require you to report income information from an earlier tax year.

- On the 2019–20 FAFSA form, you (and your parents, as appropriate) will report your 2017 income information, rather than your 2018 income information.
- Since you'll probably already have filed your 2017 taxes by the time the FAFSA form launches, you'll be able to import your tax information into the FAFSA form right away using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT). (No more logging back in to update after filing taxes!)
- Not everyone is eligible to use the IRS DRT; and the IRS DRT does not input all the financial information required on the FAFSA form. Therefore, you should have your 2017 tax return and 2017 IRS W-2 available for reference.

The IRS DRT is the fastest, most accurate way to input your tax return information into the FAFSA form. To address security and privacy concerns related to the IRS DRT, the tax return information you transfer from the IRS will not be displayed on fafsa.gov or the IRS DRT web page. Instead, you'll see "Transferred from the IRS" in the appropriate fields on fafsa.gov.

- You cannot use your 2018 tax information. We understand that for some families, 2017 income doesn't accurately reflect your current financial situation. If you have experienced a reduction in income since the 2017 tax year, you should complete the FAFSA form with the info it asks for (2017), and then contact each of the schools to which you're applying to explain and document the change in income. They have the ability to assess your situation and make adjustments to your FAFSA form if warranted.
- You cannot update your 2019–20 FAFSA form with your 2018 tax information after filing 2018 taxes. 2017 information is what's required. No updates necessary; no updates allowed.

## 5. Records of your untaxed income\*

The FAFSA questions about untaxed income may or may not apply to you; they include things like child support received, interest income, and veterans noneducation benefits. On the 2019–20 FAFSA form, you'll report 2017 tax or calendar year information when asked these questions. Find specific details for parents and students.

## 6. Records of your assets (money)\*

This section includes savings and checking account balances, as well as the value of investments such as stocks and bonds and real estate (but not the home in which your family lives). You should report the current amounts as of the date you sign the FAFSA form, rather than reporting the 2017 tax year amounts.

**Note:** Misreporting the value of investments is a <u>common FAFSA mistake</u>. Please carefully review what is and is not considered a <u>student investment</u> and <u>parent investment</u> to make sure you don't over- or under-report. You may be surprised by what can (and cannot) be excluded.

### 7. List of the school(s) you are interested in attending

Be sure to add any college you're considering, even if you haven't applied or been accepted yet.

- Even if there is only a slight chance you'll apply to a college, list the school on your FAFSA form. You can always remove schools later if you decide not to apply, but if you wait to add a school, you could miss out on first-come, first-served financial aid.
- The schools you list on your FAFSA form will automatically receive your FAFSA results electronically. They will use your FAFSA information to determine the types and amounts of financial aid you may receive.
- If you add a school to your FAFSA form and later decide not to apply for admission to that school, that's OK! The school likely won't offer you aid until you've been accepted anyway.
- You can list up to 10 schools at a time on your FAFSA form. If you're applying to more than 10 schools, here's what you should do.

**TIP:** To be considered for state aid, several states require you to list schools in a particular order (for instance, you might need to list a state school first). <u>Find out whether your state has a requirement for</u> the order in which you list schools on your FAFSA form.

\* If you're a <u>dependent student</u>, you will need this information for your parents as well.

## Ready to start?

Once you're ready, you have <u>several ways to complete the FAFSA form</u>, including the <u>fafsa.gov</u> website or the new myStudentAid mobile app. Using the app, you can fill out the FAFSA form safely and securely from your mobile device. On the app, you can also manage your FSA ID, view your federal student aid history and loan information, and more. The myStudentAid app is available from both the <u>Apple App Store (iOS)</u> and <u>Google Play (Android)</u>.

## 5 Ways to Pay Off Your Student Loans Faster

The first thing people say when they find out where I work: "Can you delete my student loans for me?" If only I had that power. Just like many of you, I am a student loan borrower. Each month, my federal student loan servicer, withdraws my \$381.35 student loan payment from my bank account and I still cringe every time. (Do you know how many trips I could take with that money?) Point is, I understand what you're going through.

That said, there are manageable ways to pay off your student loans faster than you had planned and save yourself money by doing so!

Here are some ideas:

## 1) Pay Right Away

Even though you're usually not <u>required to</u>, consider making student loan payments during your <u>grace period</u> or while you're still in school. If you're short on cash, consider at least paying enough each month to cover the amount of <u>interest</u> you're accruing. That way your interest doesn't capitalize and get added to your principal balance. Not doing this was one of the biggest <u>mistakes I made</u> with my student loans.

## 2) Sign up for Automatic Debit

If you sign up for automatic debit, your student loan servicer will automatically deduct your student loan payment from your bank account each month. Not only does this help ensure that you make payments on time, but you may also be able to get an interest rate deduction for enrolling. Contact your loan servicer to see if your loan is eligible for this benefit.

## 3) Pay More than Your Minimum Payment



Even if it's \$5 a month! Paying a little extra each month can reduce the interest you pay and reduce your total cost of your loan over time. (Pay attention! This next part is important!) If you want to ensure that your loan is paid off faster, make sure you tell your loan servicer that the extra amount you're paying is **not** intended to be put toward future payments. If given the option, ask your servicer if the additional payment amount can be allocated to your higher interest loans first.

## 4) Use Your Tax Refund



One easy way to pay off your loan faster is to dedicate your tax refund to paying off some of your student loan debt. Part of the reason you may have gotten a refund in the first place is because you get a <u>tax deduction</u> for paying student loan interest.

## 5) Seek Out Forgiveness and Repayment Options

#### STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS (and other ways the government can help you repay your loans) TEACHER LOAN FORGIVENESS If you teach full-time for five complete and consecutive academic years in certain elementary and secondary schools and educational service agencies that serve low-income families, you may be eligible for forgiveness of up to \$17,500. PUBLIC SERVICE LOAN FORGIVENESS (PSLF) If you work full-time for a government or not-for-profit organization you may qualify for forgiveness of the entire remaining balance of your Direct Loans after you've made 120 qualifying payments-that is, 10 years of payments. INCOME-DRIVEN REPAYMENT (IDR) PLAN If you repay your loans under an income-driven repayment plan, the remaining balance on your student loans will be forgiven after you make a certain number of payments MILITARY SERVICE In acknowledgement of your service, there are special benefits and repayment options for your student loans available from the U.S. Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Defense. **AMERICORPS** The Segal AmeriCorps Education Award is a post-service benefit received by participants who complete a term of national service in an approved AmeriCorps program—AmeriCorps VISTA, AmeriCorps NCCC, or AmeriCorps State and National.

There are a <u>number of situations</u> under which you can have your federal student loan balance forgiven. There are forgiveness and repayment programs for <u>teachers</u>, <u>public servants</u>, <u>members of the United States Armed Forces</u>, and <u>more</u>.

Most of these programs have very specific eligibility requirements, but if you think you might qualify, you should definitely do some research. Also, research whether your employer offers repayment assistance for employees with student loans. There are many who do!

# HOW DO I APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS?

#### **General Scholarships:**

- 1. Each scholarship has a unique application that must be completed. You can get the application in one of the following ways:
  - download an application from The Naviance Family Connection (www.rhnet.org/naviance)
  - apply online (address found in the criteria section of the R-H Counseling Connection scholarship list)
  - use a paper copy of the R-H scholarships from the College & Career Center
  - check the website and/or your counselor of the college you are attending
- 2. Complete the application making sure you follow the instructions completely. Any scholarships requiring a transcript or counselor recommendation must be submitted to the Counseling Center with a Transcript Request Form (green sheet) at least ten school days before the due date. It is your responsibility to make sure the application is complete.
- 3. If the scholarship does not require a transcript or counselor recommendation, it is your responsibility to follow all instructions given and to submit the completed application to the scholarship organization before the due date.

#### **Nomination Scholarships:**

There are many scholarships for students to self-nominate. See Ms. Moss in the College & Career Center for instructions on self-nominating.



- Pay strict attention to deadlines!
- Complete applications neatly and accurately, following instructions exactly.
- Submit <u>completed</u> applications in the Counseling Center; it is your responsibility to make sure the application is complete.
- If a transcript is required, it must be mailed by the Counseling Center. Include a signed "Green Sheet" to permit release of your transcript (remember the 10-day lead time).
- If a scholarship does not require a transcript, follow the instructions on the application and mail it as directed.
- If you receive a scholarship, be sure to <u>send a thank you note</u> to the organization granting you the scholarship.
