Services will not take place in homes or in the Compeer office until further notice.
 - Currently accepting youth referrals for the mentoring program is from 5-21 and the waitlist has no set timeframe. However, girls are matched faster than boys, accepting all referrals for PSR, Habilitation, Peer, and FST.

 - No wait for care coordination, skill builders (female) and peer mentors (female).
 - Health Home CM typically takes 2 weeks to connect after a referral is submitted.
 - For youth interested in males, there is an undermined wait at this time due to a shortage of male workers
 - Care coordination, skill building, and youth peer mentor services available through SPOA.
 - Current wait lists for care coordination and youth peer mentor (for males it is a longer wait).
 - Right now our waitlist for Non-Medicaid Care Coordination is about 2 months.
 - For youth open to female Skill Builders there is no wait. For youth looking for male Skill Builders there is a wait of approximately a month or two.
 - For youth open to female Youth Peer Mentors there a month or so wait and for youth seeking a male Youth Peer Mentor the wait is longer- still dealing with a shortage of male youth peer mentors
