College/Scholarship Application Procedures

Allow ten (10) school days for Counseling Center staff to process and submit applications.

- We strongly encourage you to apply online. Familiarize yourself with the Common Application, as well as, the online SUNY application.
- Complete a transcript release form (Green Sheet) authorizing R-H to send transcripts and other required information to college/scholarship programs. They are available in the Counseling Center, the College & Career Center and at www.rhnet.org/ccc (It may be helpful to keep extra Green Sheets at home.)
- Seniors completing applications online must still submit a Green Sheet to request that academic information be forwarded to their colleges.
- Make sure your Naviance Family Connection account is updated based on ALL colleges you are applying to (electronic & paper).
- Submit completed Green Sheets and applications with all required accompanying documents to the 12th grade secretary in the Counseling Center. R-H will mail applications directly and pay the postage. Incomplete applications will be returned to the student.

Letters of Recommendation

To request a letter from a **teacher or counselor**, students must give them a completed pink Recommendation Request Form. (Allow three to four weeks for them to complete the letter.) The **counselor** letter will be included when the application is submitted.

Teacher recommendations will be sent electronically. If applying by paper, provide the teacher with a stamped envelope addressed to the College Admissions Office. Pencil the senior's name and deadline on the envelope flap, as some teachers will be writing a number of letters.

Mid-Year Grades

Seventh semester grades will be sent <u>only</u> to the colleges that require them, and **only at the request of the student**. These grades are not available until mid-February. See the 12th grade secretary in the Counseling Center.

Please share exciting news of college acceptances received with the 12th grade secretary.



Course Adds/Drops

Seniors are encouraged to take advantage of academic opportunities at R-H. Colleges look favorably on applicants who challenge themselves.

The Rush-Henrietta Central School District Board of Education provides guidelines for dropping classes that students must meet. Be aware that colleges must be notified when a class in progress is dropped. This may affect admission status.

NCAA

Prospective student-athletes intending to participate in a sport at Division I or Division II colleges should access NCAA information/forms at the Clearinghouse website: www.ncaaclearinghouse.net - Cost \$90.00

A Green Sheet must be submitted to the 12th grade secretary to have transcripts and test scores sent to the NCAA Clearinghouse.

Final Grades

In June, seniors will complete their senior survey on Naviance Student regarding post R-H plans.

In mid-July, a final transcript will be sent to the college that the student indicated he/she will attend. (It is the responsibility of all seniors to notify other colleges to which they have been accepted of their decision not to attend.)
