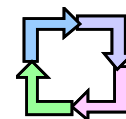
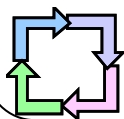

- online application (web address given in the criteria section of the scholarship list)
- online application on the College & Career Center Web page (www.rhnet.org/cc)
- online application in Naviance/Family Connection (www.rhnet.org/navianceshs)

To apply, follow the guidelines below:

- Pay strict attention to deadlines!
- Complete applications neatly and accurately, following instructions exactly.
- Submit complete applications in the Counseling Center; it is your responsibility to make sure the application is complete.
- If a transcript is required, it must be mailed by the Counseling Center. Include a signed “Green Sheet” to permit release of your transcript (remember the 10-day lead time).
- If a scholarship does not require a transcript, follow the instructions on the application and mail it as directed.
- If you receive a scholarship, be sure to send a thank you note to the organization granting you the scholarship.
- Share the exciting news of any awards that you win!
 - Notify the Counseling Center of the scholarship and the amount.

Important Information for Seniors

Remember to schedule your senior appointment with your counselor. This meeting is required regardless of your post-secondary plans. Stop in to the Counseling Center Reception Desk to make an appointment with any of the secretaries.

- ✓ Be sure you've submitted your electronic application using either the Common Application or a specific college application.
- ✓ If you've applied using a paper application, be sure to submit all required paperwork along with the green sheet to Mrs. Leatzaw in the Counseling Center.
- ✓ Be sure to submit a completed green sheet (transcript request form) to Mrs. Leatzaw in the Counseling Center for each college you've applied to.
- ✓ List all colleges you've applied to in your Naviance Family Connection account under 'Colleges I'm Applying to.'

College Acceptance:

- ✓ When you receive an acceptance from a college or you know which college you will be attending, be sure to fill out a yellow slip in the Counseling Office and give it to Mrs. Leatzaw. One pennant will be put on display in the Cafeteria for each college a senior is accepted to.
- ✓ If you earned scholarship(s), fill out a yellow slip with scholarship name and total amount you will be receiving, or email her at leatzaw@rhnet.org.
- ✓ If you applied to any colleges that require mid-year grades, see Mrs. Leatzaw in the Counseling Office for a blue request form.

After You Receive Your Admission Decisions:

- ✓ You must notify each college or university that accepts you whether you are accepting or rejecting its offer. You should make these notifications as soon as you have made a final decision as to the college you wish to attend, but no later than May 1. It is understood that May 1 will be the postmark date.
- ✓ You may confirm your intention to enroll and, if required, submit a deposit to only one college or university. The exception to this arises if you are put on a wait list by a college or university and are later admitted to that institution. You may accept the offer and send a deposit. However, you must immediately notify a college or university at which you previously indicated your intention to enroll.
- ✓ If you are accepted under an early decision plan, you must promptly withdraw the applications submitted to other colleges and universities and make no additional applications. If you are an early decision candidate and are seeking financial aid, you need not withdraw other applications until you have received notification about financial aid from the admitting early decision institution.

Rochester Scholars is the University's pre-college academic enrichment program for high school students which offer **non-credit** mini-courses reflective of areas of study available at the University.

Courses are structured like college seminars and promote learning by doing. Students actively participate in a variety of workshops, class discussions, field trips, group projects, experiments, and labs, putting newfound knowledge to use in independent and creative ways. Classes are taught by university faculty and graduate students, along with top local educators.

Students can choose to take a morning class, an afternoon class, or both. Books, supplies and lunch are included. Enrollment is limited, so be sure to register early.

- **If approved, the counselor will sign the forms, scan and email to you as a pdf**
- **Follow the “U of R Pre-College Programs RH Online Registration Instructions”** (included in Registration packet) – once completed, you will then be contacted by someone from the U of R

HOW DO I APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS?

Nomination Scholarships:

You must be nominated by a teacher or counselor; eligible students are encouraged to self-nominate. See Ms. Curry in the College & Career Center for instructions on self-nominating.

All other Scholarships:

- Each scholarship has a unique application that must be completed. You can get the application in one of the following ways:
 - hard copy in the College & Career Center
 - online application on the College & Career Center webpage (www.rhnet.org/cc)
 - online application in Naviance/Family Connection (www.rhnet.org/navianceshs)
 - apply online only (web address will be given in the criteria section of the scholarship list)

- Complete the application making sure you follow the instructions exactly. Remember that any scholarships requiring a transcript must be submitted to the Counseling Center with a Transcript Request Form (green sheet) at least 10 school days before the due date. It is your responsibility to make sure the application is complete.

- If the scholarship requires a transcript, the application will be mailed by the Counseling Center.

- If the scholarship does not require a transcript, it is your responsibility to follow all instructions given to submit the completed application to the scholarship organization before the due date.

- If you are the recipient of a scholarship, be sure to write a thank you note to the scholarship granting organization.

New York State Summer School of the Arts (NYSSSA) 2017



The **Summer of 2017** will mark the **48th year of operation** for the schools that form the New York State Summer School of the Arts. This program, with its seven component summer residential Schools, are administered by the New York State Education Department. Recognized as one of the finest programs of its kind in the nation, over 15,000 high school age students have become part of this unique summer experience. Alumni of the program will attest to the success of the schools in helping high school students with special talents identify and pursue career choices in all fields of the fine arts and performing arts at an early age. The Schools provide opportunities for all New York State students who qualify through auditions, to receive the highest level of training and instruction.

The Summer Schools of the Arts are directed and staffed by internationally acclaimed artists and companies such as the [New York City Ballet](#) and The [Philadelphia Orchestra](#). Students work in small groups and in one-on-one sessions with professionals and with other students of similar ability. **NYSSSA's goal is clear: to provide intensive, preprofessional training programs for New York State's most gifted and motivated young artists and those who are considering careers in the arts or entertainment industries.** A student's time at NYSSSA could be life changing!

The schools provide intensive training in an environment where students experience the rigorous discipline of the daily life of a professional artist. The program is open to all New York State high school age students who qualify through auditions. NYSSSA Programs qualify students for one full unit of high school credit with the student's home district approval. Lebanon Valley College Health and Biomedical Sciences Summer Camp

Through lectures and hands-on laboratory investigations in state-of-the-art laboratories, students will be introduced to the fundamentals of molecular biology, pharmacology, immunology, biochemistry, and medical ethics.
