#### **DESCRIPTION & REQUIREMENTS**

The Elmer L. Gordon Scholarship recognizes students whose activities while attending school or whose intended fields of future study reflect the values, goals, and areas of interest advanced by Mr. Gordon during his lifetime. These may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Outstanding participation in activities which further the goal of improved human relations within the school community.
- 2. Noteworthy participation in athletics and/or future study in physical education and/or coaching.
- 3. Commendable achievement in, or future study in, the field of chemistry.
- 4. Meritorious participation in district music programs or intended future study in music.
- 5. Interest in the area of rehabilitation of the physically handicapped.

#### AMOUNT OF AWARD(S)

Up to \$1,000

#### **SELECTION PROCESS**

The members of the Board of Education will make all decisions in respect to the administration and use of the Elmer Gordon Scholarship Fund. Applications are available in the high school College & Career Center. A personal interview will be required of all finalists. Interviews will be held prior to the Board of Education meeting on Tuesday, April 11, 2017, at the John W. Parker Administration Building.

# Elmer L. Gordon

Elmer L. Gordon combined a career as a prominent medical investigator with leadership in civic activities. He brought to everything he did a special persistence and determination. Outspoken, blunt, direct, Mr. Gordon believed citizens had a responsibility to become involved in their community.

As a forensic toxicologist with the Monroe County Medical Examiner's Office, Mr. Gordon built a national reputation as an expert in poisons and their detection. He was one of only 100 toxicologists licensed by the American Board of Forensic Toxicologists. From 1969 until his death, he shared his expertise with medical students at the University of Rochester where he was an associate in pharmacology.

With four children attending Rush-Henrietta schools, Mr. Gordon was elected to the Board of Education in 1970. As president from 1976 to 1978, he brought a no-nonsense approach to board business. As advocate of the taxpayer and of young people, he believed in giving students a firm academic foundation, but also called on educators to step up efforts to prepare students for jobs as well as college. He took special interest in school sports and school musical concerts and plays.

Mr. Gordon served as president of the Monroe County School Boards Association. He was an organizing member of the Henrietta Youth Board and served on the town of Henrietta's Cable Television Committee. Mr. Gordon served on the board of directors of the Rochester Area Multiple Sclerosis Association and he was on the board of the Al Sigl Center.

In all his activities, Mr. Gordon stressed two themes: "Young people are our most important resource," and "People have a responsibility to their community to change things by getting involved, taking the risks and the responsibility."

In recognition of Mr. Gordon's outstanding public service and civic leadership, the Board of Education of the Rush-Henrietta Central School District has established an Elmer Gordon Scholarship Fund to assist in the future education of Rush-Henrietta graduates.
