

Foreign Language Scholarships at St. John Fisher College

Each year, St. John Fisher College offers **two** Foreign Language Scholarships to entering freshmen. These scholarships recognize achievement in foreign language as a sound preparation for college work and encourage students to pursue their interest in foreign languages. Please announce this excellent source of financial aid to qualifying students. Preference will be given to students who plan to pursue at least a minor in a foreign language.

Foreign Language Scholarship:

What:

Two \$12,000 Foreign Language Scholarships (\$3,000 each year for four years, provided the student completes two foreign language courses during his or her first year at Fisher, and maintains a minimum 3.00 cumulative average). Preference will be given to students who plan to pursue at least a minor in a foreign language.

Who:

Available to all high school seniors with proficiency in French or Spanish, and a minimum 1000 SAT or 22 ACT composite score. Students of all majors are eligible for this scholarship, with priority given to those students majoring in a foreign language.

Candidates must:

- Demonstrate excellence in scholarship, character, leadership, and service.
- Demonstrate a minimum composite score of 1000 on the SAT (Math and Critical Reading) or 22 on the ACT.
- Demonstrate no less than 85% cumulative academic average. Schools using a different grading scale must convert their notation to a 100-point scale.
- Demonstrate a communicative ability in both the spoken and written language with complete speech utterances that move beyond the present tense.

How:

Students must be nominated by their high school foreign language teacher or school counselor. Each high school may nominate two candidates. Finalists will be interviewed to determine foreign language competency.

Where:

Interviews will take place on the St. John Fisher College campus, 3690 East Avenue, Rochester, New York 14618.

When:

Nomination forms must be received by Friday, January 22, 2016. Finalists will be notified no later than Friday, February 5, 2016. At that time, finalist interviews will be set up for Friday, February 12 and Saturday, February 13, 2016. During the 45-minute interview, the finalist must demonstrate conversational skills in his or her chosen foreign language. In addition, he or she will be asked to write a descriptive essay in a foreign language within twenty minutes. All finalists are invited to have lunch or dinner on campus as part of their visit.

The following documents must be submitted no later than January 22, 2016:

- Foreign Language Scholarship Nomination Form
- One Classroom Teacher Evaluation from the foreign language teacher, which addresses the student's abilities and achievement in foreign language as well as the student's overall academic and intellectual potential.
- One Classroom Teacher Evaluation from any other teacher who can address the student's overall academic and intellectual potential.
- An official academic transcript (If not already submitted with your Application for Admission to St. John Fisher College.)

All materials <u>must</u> be received by the deadline. Incomplete nominations will <u>not</u> be considered.
