## Alumni Return to R-H to Support Student Career Day

Alumni returned this past fall to Rush-Henrietta Senior High School, where they shared their secrets to success with students interested in learning more about specific careers. They returned to take part in the first Student Career Day, sponsored by the Rush-Henrietta Alumni Council.

During Student Career Day, alumni:

- reinforced to students that they should have high expectations about what they achieve in high school, providing examples of how they pushed themselves when they were students, and explaining how they took advantage or wish they had of particular classes or opportunities available to students today.
- drew on personal experience to stress to students the importance of taking four years of math and science courses, as well as exploring foreign languages, urging students to pursue a well-developed course foundation.
- described the continuing education or additional training they have received since high school or college, and shared why that extra learning has been crucial to their success.
- discussed their career field and provided insight into available jobs students might not know about, as well as new jobs that are still on the horizon.

#### Alumni Info, Reunion Updates are Online

With more than 4,800 entries in the district's online alumni database, doing so is easier today than ever. The Alumni Center provides several useful methods to locate Rush-Henrietta graduates. Interested in finding out what a high school friend has been up to since graduation? To perform a search, enter a first and last name, or choose a particular year and look through the entries for that graduating class. Want to look up someone, but can't remember his or her complete name? In the Alumni Center, simply enter a first or last name to narrow down the results. For example, searching for the name "Eric" yields 31 entries, ranging from 1964 to 2002. That should make it easier to pick out the Eric who sat next to you during study hall. You also can post reunion information and learn about upcoming reunions. ### Rush-Henrietta Alumni Council Seeks Nominees for 2010 Hall of Fame

The Rush-Henrietta Alumni Council Hall of Fame will induct new members during the Fall 2010 homecoming weekend. The Hall of Fame inductions will take place Saturday, Oct. 9.

Council members are seeking Hall of Fame nominees whose personal and professional life are considered exemplary, and whose successes will serve as an inspiration to current Rush-Henrietta students.

Last year, the council inducted three alumni into the Hall of Fame: U.S. Army Maj. Michael Baka '94, John "Jack" Gaffney '51, and Jonathan Plutzik' 72. The induction ceremony takes place preceding the annual homecoming football game and provides an attractive venue in which to honor these notable alumni and recognize their accomplishments.

Since 2000, graduates selected as "Distinguished Alumni" also have been honored through support of the Rush-Henrietta Education Foundation. Names of those selected as Distinguished Alumni in past years appear on an Alumni Hall of Fame plaque displayed at the Senior High School.

To be considered for induction to the Rush-Henrietta Alumni Council Hall of Fame, council members will apply the following criteria to all who are nominated:

- Nominees must be graduates of a high school operated within the towns of Rush and/or Henrietta, including Rush High School or the Monroe Academy in Henrietta. Eligible graduates also may have earned diplomas from any of the more recent high schools that served residents of the Rush-Henrietta Central School District, including the Rush-Henrietta High School from 1952 to 1968, the James E. Sperry High School from 1969 to the present, or the Charles Roth building during years in which it was operating as a second high school in the district.
- Nominees may have succeeded at local, regional, national, or international levels in any appropriate area of endeavor (academia and/or education, the arts, business, public service,

the media, medicine, the military, philanthropy, science, sports, as examples).

- Alumni may be nominated posthumously.
- Anyone may nominate a R-H alumnus or alumna, but you may not nominate yourself. Nominators need not have attended Rush-Henrietta schools in order to submit a nomination.
- Incomplete nominations will not be considered. Nominators must provide details about those aspects that make the nominee worthy of induction into the Alumni Hall of Fame.

Nominations for the 2010 Rush-Henrietta Alumni Hall of Fame must be received no later than Friday, May 21, 2010. The nomination must be submitted on an approved form for this purpose.

The form can be downloaded from the Rush-Henrietta Web site. Simply visit www.rhnet.org/halloffame to download a form and learn more! Supporting materials, including resumes and letters of recommendation, are welcome.

Nominating materials will be reviewed by all members of the R-H Alumni Council Board of Directors as part of the selection process. Nominees who are not selected automatically will advance to the following year's collection of nominees, unless the nominator asks that the name be withdrawn.
