Dear Parents/Guardians of Rush-Henrietta 5th through 11th Grade Students:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the benefits and opportunities for your child to participate in advanced coursework. Advanced coursework opportunities begin in 7th grade (in math only) and continue throughout their secondary school career.

While advanced coursework provides an opportunity for your child to gain skills and demonstrate competencies at a higher level, advanced coursework provides other benefits as well which may include:

- improving a student's self-confidence and self-image.
- demonstrating a student's preparedness for college-level coursework.
- earning college credit(s) prior to graduation.
- reducing future costs for higher education.
- reducing the amount of time that the student must spend in secondary and/or post-secondary school.

The advanced courses offered in junior and senior high school at Rush-Henrietta Central School District are provided in this linked guide R-H Advanced Course Guide. The complete list of courses offered to your child throughout their 7-12th grade years are listed in this linked Secondary Program Course Guide.

To help your child succeed in advanced courses, the following supports are provided by your child's school:
