Important Information

- Counselors will be going into classes in December to talk with students about selecting courses for next year, about understanding high school graduation requirements, and about planning for their future career pathways.
- A Google Form will be sent to all students by their school counselor. This form the Course Selection Worksheet will help students identify the required courses they must take next year and help them pick the elective courses they wish to take. This will be sent electronically to students on Dec 20th.
- Students should use the Secondary Course Program Guide to help them select the courses they want. Here is the link!

Secondary Program Course Guide

In January and February, counselors will schedule individual meetings with each student to discuss their course requests, review grades and transcripts, and develop a graduation plan based upon each student's long-term career and college goals.

Important Dates

- The Course Selection Worksheet Google Form will be emailed to you in December by your counselor.
- January 6: Course Selection Worksheet is due back to your counselor.
- January 6 February 28: Course selection meetings with counselors will be scheduled (if your parents wish to attend, please have them call the counseling office by January 6 so we can accommodate them). Parents will be able to join via Google Meets or in person.
- Early March: Course requests will be available on SchoolTool for each student – please check to make sure they are accurate!
- March 5: The last day to request changes to course requests.

How to prepare for your scheduling meeting with your counselor

- Think about your college and career goals (review any surveys you've done in Naviance or in Home and Careers class).
- Look through the Secondary Program Course Guide to review the required courses you must take and the elective classes you can choose to take. The guide is listed on the Google Form you will fill out for your course requests and is also available on the district website under the student services and counseling services tabs.
- Fill out the Course Selection Worksheet that your counselor will email to you and send it back by January 6.
- Make sure you provide a couple back-up electives in case you don't get your first choice. Do your best to pick the classes you want – it can be hard to make changes later on in the spring or summer. If any classes you want are closed out or canceled, we'll use your back-up selections to fill in your schedule.

Preparing for scheduling meeting, continued

- Give careful consideration to taking an art or music class in 8th or 9th grade remember you need a full art or music class to graduate.
- 9th graders consider whether or not you wish to continue in World Language level II
- Be on time for your meeting with your counselor don't be late!
- In-person meetings in the counseling office will be between 7:30-2:00, during a study hall, if you have one. If you don't, we'll try to see you during a non-core class. You'll get a pass from your counselor.

Four-Year Planning Definitions



- Required Course: One you must take for high school graduation
- Elective Course: A course you choose to take based on your interests and educational goals
- Prerequisite: A class that you have to pass before you can take another class that you want

Four-Year Planning Definitions



- 1 Credit: A unit of study for high school graduation granted for passing a full-year course
- 1/2 Credit: A unit of study granted for a course which meets for only one semester or the equivalent
- GPA: Grade point average
