The Rush-Henrietta Central School District is located just minutes south of the city of Rochester. It serves a population of approximately 46,000 residents, encompasses 63 square miles, and includes the communities of Rush, Henrietta, West Brighton and a very small portion of Pittsford. The northern portion of the district is primarily commercial and industrial, with the southern being rural residential with an agricultural base. Most residents of the district are employed in Rochester-area industries and businesses. The district is located in close proximity to several area college campuses including the

University of Rochester, Monroe Community College, Rochester Institute of Technology, St. John Fisher College, and Nazareth College. The district is made up of four elementary schools (K-3), two elementary schools (4-6), two junior high schools (7-9), the Senior High School (10-12), and the Webster Learning Center.

The Senior High School is accredited by the New York State Department of Education and complies with the NACAC Statement of Principles of Good Practice.

CURRICULUM INFORMATION - Class of 2024

Rush-Henrietta Senior High School offers approximately 200 courses, including 14 Advanced Placement courses. Some students are enrolled in Algebra and Earth Science in eighth grade. Eleventh and twelfth grade students with at least an 80% cumulative average are given the opportunity to take college courses at the University of Rochester and Rochester Institute of Technology tuition-free. Through a partnership with Monroe Community College, Dual Enrollment Courses are offered.

English: Regents in grades 9-12; Honors in grade 10; AP Language & Composition and AP Literature & Composition in grades 11 and 12; four semester electives

Social Studies: Regents in grades 9-12: Global History in grades 9 (World History Pre-AP) and 10 (AP World History); U.S. History and Government in grade 11 (AP U.S. History); Civics and Citizenship (AP Government & Politics) and Online Civics and Citizenship, Economics (AP Economics) in grade 12 and Online Economics; Intro to Psychology, AP Psychology; Intro to Sociology; Criminal Law; and American Women: Past & Present

Math: Regents Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II; AP Statistics; Applied Statistics; Math Explorations; Math and Financial Applications; Pre-Calculus; AP Calculus (AB), College Prep Math and AP Computer Science A

Science: Regents Biology, Chemistry and Physics; AP Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, and Physics I; Forensic Science I and II; Physical Science - Chemistry and -Physics; Food Science; Digital Earth; and Project Lead the Way (PLTW): Principles of Biomedical Sciences; Human Body Systems; Medical Interventions; Biomedical Innovation

and/or

Attaining a minimum score on the appropriate AP or SAT Subject Tests
